# THE BLUE LINE:

SGT. GEORGE BROZZO

Did you know as of January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021 it is now illegal in Virginia to even hold a cell phone, or any other handheld personal communication device <u>while driving a motor vehicle</u>. This includes making a phone call not just texting. You may only do so if you are stopped or parked, or to report an emergency. This is a primary offense so you can be stopped by the police just for that alone. The first penalty is a \$125 fine and then any subsequent offenses will be a \$250 fine. It only takes a second to be distracted while driving; this is a good law and the life you save may be your own.

# COVID-19

The town office has been and will continue to be closed to the public due to Covid-19 for at least but not limited to two weeks. During this time, you may conduct business through the mail slot. We ask that you be patient with us. We follow all necessary precautions to keep you and our staff safe. Chairs, doorknobs, and the mail slot are wiped with Clorox disinfectant wipes after each visit (while the town clerk is on site). The office is frequently fogged with an EPA approved sanitizing mist. Social distancing is adhered to and masks are encouraged. We apologize for the inconvenience this may cause and appreciate your patience during this time.

# **TRASH PICK-UP FEE**

### VICTORIA EDWARDS

The Town Trash fee is mandatory for all town residents. If you are new to the Town of Boykins, please visit or call the town office so that we may keep our records updated. If your account is outstanding, we will be moving forward with collection efforts March 1<sup>st</sup>. You may pay quarterly at \$27 or annually at \$100. You supply your own garbage can.

As a reminder, yard debris such as leaves, and pine straw must be in bags. Limbs and yard debris are picked up Tuesday. Large household items are also picked up Tuesday if unable to pick-up Monday. All items must be at the curb/roadside by 8am.
